

Common elements for 10-page CV

Since many nominees have CVs that are longer than 10 pages, there may be questions about what to include within this limit. The following list of common elements was prepared after reviewing some of the 10-page CVs of BMES Fellows elected in 2020. These are just suggestions, and the lengths of these sections will be different for each nominee, but the information in these sections was found to be very useful by the Fellows Committee when evaluating the nominations.

Academic Fellow Nominees

Element	Average Fraction of Page
Education and Training	0.15
Employment / Research Experience	0.33
Selected Honors and Awards	0.5
Publications (all or selected), chapters, and patents	4
Invited Presentations (selected)	0.75 (this element had a wide range)
Courses Taught	0.15 (this will be much longer for teaching-focused nominees)
Service to Professional Societies (making sure to highlight BMES)	0.6 (this element had a wide range and will be much longer for service-focused nominees)
Grant review service	0.25
Manuscript review / editorial roles	0.25 (this element had a wide range)
STEM outreach and diversity related service	0.2 (this element had a wide range)
University service	0.15 (this element had a wide range)
Trainees mentored	1.2
Research funding	1
Society memberships	0.1

Industry Fellow Nominees

Element	Average Fraction of Page
Education and Training	0.3
Employment / Research Experience	2
Selected Honors and Awards	1
Publications (all or selected), chapters, and patents	2-3
Invited Presentations (selected)	1
Professional Service activities (including societies and BMES)	2
